

#### **Eligibility:**

- 1. This competition is open to all Undergraduate, MS and PhD graduate student researchers studying topics related to energy, water, and waste conservation.
- 2. Contestants must be physically present from  $8:30 \,\mathrm{am} 3:30 \,\mathrm{pm}$  on  $02/25 \,\mathrm{th}$  to discuss your posters with visitors (faculty, students, staff, and guests) and judges.

# You are responsible for printing your own Rigid Poster and must bring it to the competition:

No poster can be larger than 36 inches long x 48 inches wide. Easels will be provided

#### **Judging Criteria:**

- **Overall Scientific/Technical Merit** (the technical quality of the work)
- **Significance of the Work** (*Does the work address a problem important to its technical field and/or society; and is this persuasively communicated by the poster?*)
- Quality of the Research Strategy (this metric judges the strength of the experimental and/or theoretical design)
- Clarity of Poster to a Non-Expert (Is the poster easy to read, easy to follow, and does it effectively highlight the research)
- **Presentation of Poster** (How well did you verbally explain the work?)

#### **Submittal Guidelines**

To be eligible for the competition, students must submit their abstract as directed below via email to Dr. Nabil Nassif at <a href="mailto:nnassif@ncat.edu">nnassif@ncat.edu</a> prior to the end of business January 31, 2014. The abstract can either be research that is done as part of the students Program of Study or a campus or community oriented project that you have initiated. A wide range of energy-related topics will be accepted including efficiency, renewables, education, policy, and pollution. The primary contribution must be from the student with assistance from the faculty advisor.

#### The abstract must include:

- Proposed Title
- Indication of category: applied project or research
- Author's name, major, faculty advisor name, and university
- Author's education level (undergraduate or graduate student, must be a current student)
- Phone number and e-mail address of student and faculty advisor
- A written description of the research no longer than 500 words that includes:
  - Introduction
  - o Approach/Method/Scheme
  - o Preliminary Results/Evaluation
  - Conclusion/Future Work

#### **How to Submit**

#### **Selection**

A panel of reviewers will evaluate the content of all abstract submissions based on relevance to the topic, project innovation, clear objectives with appropriate evaluation of the research, and clarity and organization of the writing. Three graduate students and three undergraduate students will be selected. Those selected to compete at the Appalachian Energy Summit Mid-Year Meeting will be contacted by February 5, 2014 and given further instructions (poster specifications, best practices, etc.) to prepare a poster for the competition.
